**President's Report** President Pasichnyk asked for a Nominating Committee to recommend a slate of officers for the

He announced that at our May 6<sup>th</sup> meeting our guest Kendra McQuilton, from The ECG Group, will discuss district energy efficiency projects and conservation, and reminded all that our Annual Meeting & Dinner is June 3rd at Cosimo's Brick

Oven in Middletown with guest speaker Robert Schneider, Executive Director of NYSSBA.

Neel Choudhury, from the law firm of TDWPM, reviewed in detail the past 50 years of free

**Students & Free Speech:** speech law as it applies to students, beginning with the Tinker Decision of 1969, which Tinker's Relevance Today

confirmed that students don't "shed their constitutional right to freedom of speech at the schoolhouse gate", but also recognized the need to determine the degree that student free speech might materially and substantially interfere with a school's primary function to provide

disciplined education. Mr. Choudhury discussed related topics including what controls over expression a school can regulate, what defines a substantial disruption, reasonably forecasting a disruption, school sponsored speech vs. individual speech, obscene speech, defining

controversial images and symbols, political expression, student protests and walkouts, and unreasonable time/place/manner restrictions on such, and finished with off-campus speech and

examples of protected and unprotected out of school speech.

**OU-BOCES:** Bill Hecht and Deborah Heppes took attendees through the development of OU-BOCES' 2020-**Budget Review** 2021 proposed budget with a close look at the Administrative Budget and a discussion of the

various services and programs offered through BOCES as well as BOCES' assistance in helping

districts obtain funding through grants.

**Legislative Review** Vice President Flaherty reviewed OCSBA's February legislative appointments held during

NYSSBA's Capital Conference. Legislative Director Bill Boss encouraged members to attend in

the future and be their districts' "voice" in meeting with legislators.
